

Local resources are not unlimited

Goodwill

Greenland is a country in itself and Danish researchers are visitors/foreigners

Infrastructure and staff

The hospitals and health centres are usually pleased to assist researchers – on a collaborative basis and with reimbursement of expenses

Population

There is a competition for research participants; the total Inuit population is about 50,000 and signs of research fatigue are beginning to show

Absorption of results

Don't propose solutions to health problems unless you are 100% familiar with the Greenland context (which you are probably not)

Rules and regulations


The research ethical system is different from that of Denmark. All research has to be endorsed by the Research Ethical Committee for Greenland (Det videnskabsetiske udvalg for Grønland) and the Danish Datatilsynet
